I'm proud to present to you, then, the output of an historic undertaking by the Immaculata Administration, Faculty and Advisory Council: a strategic plan that maps our path to a long, sustainable and successful future for Immaculata High School. Covering both immediate needs and those as far as three years out, the strategic plan will be updated each year on a rolling basis to reflect the needs of the people we serve.

When in August 2014 we hired Immaculata's first lay principal in our 52-year history, the change prompted significant self-reflection, including an evaluation of the relevancy of our mission. The secularization of the world around us impinges on our families and students, and we wanted to ensure that we lived up to our promise of an outstanding academic and truly catholic education for our students.

To help us in that assessment and the subsequent strategic planning, we engaged the support of the Center for Catholic School Excellence at Mount Saint Mary's University in Emmitsburg, Maryland. A group of our administrators, faculty and Advisory Council members worked hand in hand with their team to generate the basis of the plan that will guide Immaculata to vibrant institutional growth over the long term.

I am proud to present here the strategic plan goals and objectives that will ensure we achieve our mission. I am confident that it will guide Immaculata High School and the entire Spartan family of parents, students and alumni boldly into the future, forming future generations of students who will serve as tomorrow's leaders in our communities. With God's grace, the intercession of Mary Immaculate, and the support of this great school community, we will achieve our goals.

Objective 3: The Administrative Cabinet will review and revise current recruitment, hiring and mentoring policies in order to maintain the highest quality teachers and staff.










Goal 3:

Curriculum

The path to college is unique for each student. Immaculata will provide professional development opportunities for its faculty so that they will continue to provide different learning opportunities for our students. All students will be challenged to reach their full potentials so as to gain access to the college of their choice.



Objective 1: Immaculata will reorganize the Curriculum Coordinating Council to ensure that all curricula are consistently updated to reflect best practices and 21st century skills and to ensure that expectations for AP, Honors and College Prep courses are realized.

Objective 2: Immaculata will create a partnership with a Catholic University to serve as a source for future teachers and to bridge the gap to college.

Objective 3: Immaculata will develop a close bridge between I.H.S. and I.C.S. and with other catholic schools to ensure a smooth and flawless transition from elementary to high school.

Objective 4: Immaculata will continue to analyze test data to increase student achievement.









Goal 4:

Technology

New technology and resources are necessary in order to maintain the high quality of instruction which is the hallmark of Immaculata. A new technology instructional facilitator position will be created and charged with providing guidance to faculty so that existing and emerging technology may be fully employed in the education process.



Objective 1: Redefine the job description of a technology instructional facilitator position.

Objective 2: Create a rolling technology plan to insure school stays on the cutting edge in its use of technology.









Goal 5:

Finance

Immaculata High School will continue close fiscal monitoring of budgets and will provide comfortable, clean and superior facilities for students and faculty. Future plans include conducting a Capital Campaign starting this spring to renovate the theatre, cafeteria, classrooms and other infrastructure needs to facilitate learning in a comfortable and inspiring environment.



Objective 1: Conduct a Capital Campaign among all stake holders to fund some long term capital needs.

Objective 2: The Advancement Office will establish clear annual fundraising goals and seek to grow revenue from the Annual Appeal and other Fund Raising efforts.

Objective 3: Create a small but nimble group of stakeholders to secure grants in technology and various curriculum fields.


- Objective 1: Immaculata will empower faculty, students, staff and volunteers to participate in the marketing plan to attract the best students to the school.
